MPAA STATEMENT ON SENATE CONFIRMATION OF VICTORIA ESPINEL AS INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY ENFORCEMENT COORDINATOR

Washington, D.C. – Motion Picture Association of America, Inc. Chairman and CEO Dan Glickman made the following announcement upon the Senate’s confirmation of Victoria Espinel as the nation’s first Intellectual Property Enforcement Coordinator:

“Now that the Senate has confirmed Victoria Espinel as the administration’s Intellectual Property Enforcement Coordinator, we look forward to working with her in this new and increasingly important role. Intellectual property industries are an essential economic engine to the U.S. economy, and it is critical that the new IP Enforcement Coordinator now be given adequate resources to carry out her new responsibilities.

We commend President Obama for appointing such a capable and experienced advocate for the artists and creators who make their living by creating the content that is not only loved by millions of consumers around the world, but that is a significant contributor to the American economy. And we applaud the Senate for confirming the appointment.

Given her extensive experience working on intellectual property issues as the former Assistant United States Trade Representative for Intellectual Property and Innovation along with her work as the chief U.S. trade negotiator on IP issues before the World Trade Organization, Espinel brings a wealth of knowledge and expertise to the position.”
